

# Do you have Infertility?

## This research study may be for you.

---

Stanford University Medical Center researchers are trying to determine which of three medications (gonadotropins, clomiphene, or letrozole) may be the best option for fertility treatment when used along with intrauterine insemination. The study covers the cost of treatment.

**You may be eligible to volunteer if you:**

- Are 18 – 40 years of age
- Have 9 or more periods per year of infertility

**Study requirements include:**

- A test to determine if your fallopian tubes are open
- A semen analysis from your partner

If these tests have not already been done, they can be performed as part of the study's screening process.

**If you participate, you would need to:**

- Visit Stanford University Medical Center
- Take a study medication
- Keep a diary
- Have a physical exam and blood work
- Undergo an intrauterine insemination for each cycle.
